## School Starts with Focus on Joint Goals Back to School Night Highlights Importance of Values

Grill Hall was full of enthusiastic parents as the school year really got underway at the annual SJE *Back to School Night*. This yearly event at St. John Eudes School gives parents a great chance to learn about the focus of the new school year and to meet the teachers, staff and administrators. Held in conjunction with the first SJE Parent-Teacher Support Organization (PTSO) General Meeting of the year, parents receive information about upcoming PTSO events and programs, as well as the direction that the educational program at SJE will take for the coming year.

This year PTSO president Mary Cooley-Lopez addressed the parents and spoke about a number of important events including the upcoming Jog-A-Thon and Halloween Hop. She also provided a preview of the annual PTSO Spring Gala announcing it will be held off-campus at the Woodland Hills Hilton in a *Casino Royale 007* style.

Then, before the parents headed off to meet the teachers in the classrooms, Mrs. Danowitz addressed the parents and spoke about the choice of values that can be made in educating children by their parents and teachers. She noted that choosing the right values is critical to developing a child's youthful aspirations into adult accomplishments. And she highlighted the importance of the *home-school partnership*.

### **The St. John Eudes Chapter of the National Junior Honor Society held its induction ceremony**

and welcomed over 30 students into the organization for the 2017-18 school year. The organization recognizes outstanding academic achievement and helps develop leadership skills. Students meet monthly and will be working on a service project to help support important community goals and efforts.

### **SJE students became involved in hurricane relief efforts and raised funds to help the victims of Hurricane Harvey.**

With the realization that Hurricane Harvey was the costliest tropical cyclone on record, shattering the record set by Hurricane Katrina

by nearly double, and is the second-costliest natural disaster worldwide behind only the 2011 Japan earthquake and tsunami, SJE students raised nearly \$1,200 to send to Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston to support their relief efforts. Knowing that they can make a difference when others are in need is an important lesson for our students to learn.

**Author Day helps bring focus to the value of literary skills** by allowing our students to meet an actual author and learn about being a writer. This year, author/illustrator Joe Cepeda, who has received recognition for his exceptional children's books, is featured on this special day. His books and illustrations

have received a number of awards and nominations. Students are able to interact with the author, ask questions, and get their books autographed.

**Students participated in the Great California ShakeOut** which was observed statewide to help individuals and organizations get better prepared for major earthquakes and practice how to best be protected when earthquakes happen. The question is not if an earthquake will happen, but when. And if it happens while school is in session we want to assure that our students are able to react quickly, calmly and properly to protect themselves.

**October is Respect Life Month and students showed their respect for life** by supporting the efforts of the Pregnancy Counseling Center in Mission Hills. The Center provides counseling and help for pregnant women, particularly those who need help with unplanned pregnancies. Offering positive choices, the Center respects the core value of life beginning with birth and offers free or low cost assistance. Our students raised nearly \$400 for the Center's recent Baby Bottle Coin Collection drive to raise operating funds for the Center.




